
Methodology


- 1203 voters aged 18 and above were interviewed via telephone from 16 18 November 2022
- The survey respondents in all states across Peninsular Malaysia, including all 165 parliamentary districts
- Voters were selected through random stratified sampling method along the lines of ethnicity, gender, age and parliament constituencies.

- Survey margin of error estimated at ±2.83% on a three-day moving average








Factors Influencing Voting Choice




Q: Which of the following is the main factor influencing you in making your voting choice?




Preferred PM Candidate













Bad Weather Impact (% of voters willing to vote in rainy situation, only those scoring "5")
